

Isshiki Night High School provides various opportunities to meet people, discover new things and grow up.

Many students in this school come to school after work. Around 5.p.m, students and teachers eat school dinner together at the canteen. Students have ST(time to confirm their schedule) at 5:45 in their classrooms. 1st period starts from 5:50. Every class has 45 minutes. Teachers often use slides and illustrations to help students understand. Students can learn slowly from the basics to advanced contents, using tablets.

We have multi-national students with roots in various countries. Now we have students from the Philippines, Brazil, Vietnam, Indonesia, Peru, Nepal, Argentina, Bolivia and China. In the recess, we hear many languages. In the class, handouts with *furigana* above *kanji* are used. Teachers use plain Japanese for the students to help them understand better. We expect students to learn consideration to others, respect each other and grow up together through sharing different languages and cultures.

1st graders have a school trip in May. In June, many students do self-study before and after the class for the examination. We also have Sports Tournament in June, Sports Festival in September, Night Festa (Culture Festival) in October and farewell party in February. In every event, students take a leading part, give ideas and cooperate with each other.

We have club activities (*BUKATSU*), too. We have Trach and Field club, Badminton club, Judo club, Basketball club, Calligraphy club, Table tennis club, Volunteer and Multicultural activities. Students work on club activities after the class.

Some students graduate in three years studying at *TSUSHINSEI* (correspondence high school). Students also have opportunities to think about themselves and their future through *Sogo* (integrated) class throughout four years.

Isshiki Night High School supports students on a continuing basis throughout four years for them to think deeply on their own, learn well and set sail to their bright future after the graduation.
